## Fig Garden Woman's Club Board Meeting Minutes February 5, 2024

**Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order at 9:36 a.m. by President Teresa Kirkorian.

**Vice President's Report:** Vice President Kim Gould thanked Carol Lamborn and Betty Connor for providing the beautiful array of refreshments.

**Second Vice President:** Second Vice President Desiree Ward reminded those who signed up for the tour of the Rescue Mission City Center that it is tomorrow at 2 p.m. If you didn't sign up and would like to go, see her after the meeting. She reported that this month's speaker will be Kristina Richardson from Valley Public Radio who will be speaking about StoryCorp.

**Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer Susan Simpson reported; that as of January 31, 2024, our overall financial assets are \$225,163.54 in our accounts. Our checking account balance is \$104,241.35. Endowment Fund balance is \$75,192.27, Building Maintenance Fund is \$32,204.89 and Memorial Building Fund is \$13,525.03. In January we had income of \$6,453.44 and expenses of \$5,482 for a net gain of \$971.44. She received four bills today. Gala netted \$4,897.96, So far the card party has netted \$2,725 but we are still waiting for the lunch bill. We have already collected \$1,940.75 for the Antique Sale with no expenses so far. She also shared that about eight years ago we purchased a laptop to use with Quickbooks but Quickbooks no longer works with the version on her laptop. Annie helped her migrate our info to Quickbooks online.

**Third Vice President Report:** Third Vice President Becky Morlock reported that she received an application for Peggy Abels requesting Life Membership status. She has been a member for 37 years. Mary Vaughan read the procedure for Life membership which does not require a vote. Becky will let Susan Pappas know so she can change her status in the handbook. Suzanne will post it in the Fig Leaf.

**Corresponding Secretary's Report:** Corresponding Secretary Liz Conner reported that no correspondence was sent, we received three donation requests from: Hope Now, Saint Francis Homeless Project, and Fresno Mission . We received one invitation to Hope Now Annual Banquet on February 29. We received a year-end report from Hope Now and the GFW/CFWC-California Clubwoman Magazine

**Approval of the Minutes:** Recording Secretary Suzanne Crosina-Sahm reminded everyone to sign in on the sheet at the head table. She announced the minutes of the January board meeting were published in the February Fig Leaf and asked if there were any additions, corrections or deletions. Mary Vaughan noted that under the nominating section she is noted as the chairperson. She is not the chair, she is Parliamentarian. Suzanne asked if there were any other edits. Marsha Wagner moved that the minutes be approved and Barb Moen seconded the motion. The minutes were approved as corrected.

**Clubhouse:** Teresa reported that the board approved to have four podocarpus trees remove from our property as they were too close to our plumbing and wiring. We are still trying to work with our neighbor to do something about hers. We have a leak in our kitchen sink and she has called a plumber to figure out what is going on and to replace a filter. The water is off in the kitchen now but it will be fixed tomorrow. The easels have been moved to the first shed outside. There are items in the counter in the kitchen; please see if anything belongs to you, if not they will go to Trash to Treasure.

StoryCorp is committed to the idea that everyone has an important story to tell and that everyone's story matters. Their mission is to help us believe in each other by illuminating the humanity and possibility in us all — one story at a time. Since their founding in 2003, they've helped nearly 700,000 people across the country have meaningful conversations about their lives. These recordings are collected in the U.S. Library of Congress which is now the largest single collection of human voices ever gathered. She shared an example of a conversation from a StoryCorp program called One Small Step where people of differing political views can come together and have a civilized conversation to remind us that we have more in common than not. Kristina encouraged members to go to [Storycorp.org](http://Storycorp.org) to learn more to share your stories.

The Antique Sale has only shown revenues so far and no expenses, so she will have a report on that for the membership next month.

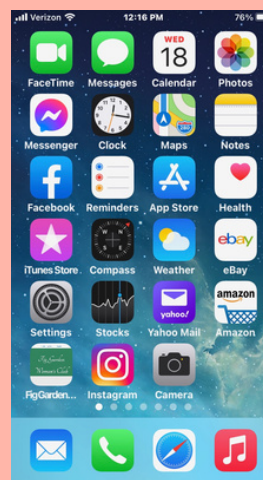
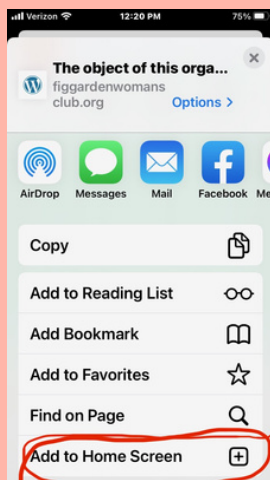

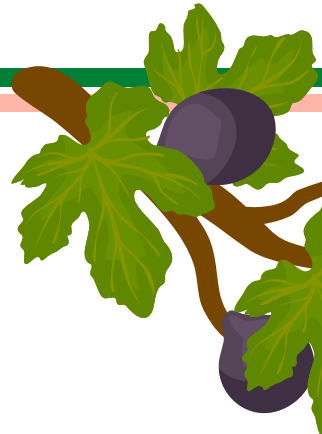
