

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 9:35 a.m. by President Teresa Kirkorian.

Vice President's Report: Vice President Kim Gould gave a big shout out to Patty Cortez and Marla Speechly for the beautiful set up at today's meeting. They used our nice Fig Garden Woman's Club coffee service and provided a wonderful spread. Kim also reported that we have all new coffee pots in the coffee room

Second Vice President: Second Vice President Desiree Ward reported that our speaker at the March General Meeting will be Dr. Saam Noonsuk the cultural advisor the the Chaffee Zoo's new Kingdoms of Asia exhibit

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Susan Simpson reported; that as of February 29, 2024, our overall financial assets are \$212,594.80 in our accounts. Our checking account balance is \$91,113.16. Endowment Fund balance is \$76,497.18, Building Maintenance Fund is \$31,447.96 and Memorial Building Fund is \$13,536.50. In February we had income of \$5,034.50 and expenses of \$22,860.16. We had net income of \$5,047.96 from Gala, \$1,369 from the Card Party, \$2,870.54 from the Antique Show, \$950 from the Antique Show Pre-Party, and \$280 so far for the Fashion Show. Susan was thrilled to share that after months of paperwork and coordination, our club received our raffle permit from the Department of Justice. Going forward, we are required to keep our raffle income separate from all other income and must report on our raffle income to the DOJ and show how much of that income goes to charities. Teresa thanked Susan for her professionalism and hard work.

Corresponding Secretary's Report: Corresponding Secretary Liz Conner reported that no correspondence was sent, we received 11 donation requests from: Hope Now, Penny Pines, Friends of the Dance Child, Valley Center for the Blind, Fresno Philharmonic, Portraits of Hope Ministry, Ebony Monique Easter, Central Valley Scouting, Friends of Camp El-O-Win, Sierra Meadows Foundation and the Fresno Art Museum. We received no invitation, year-end reports, or magazines.

Approval of the Minutes: Recording Secretary Suzanne Crosina-Sahm reminded everyone to sign in on the sheet at the head table. She announced the minutes of the February board meeting were published in the March Fig Leaf and asked if there were any additions, corrections or deletions. Susan Simplson noted that transition from laptop accounting software to online was done by Annie Anderson. Suzanne asked if there were any other edits. Barb Moen moved that the minutes be approved as corrected and Barb Marsha Wagner seconded the motion. The minutes were approved as corrected.

President's Report: Teresa reported that she has been trying to work with our neighbor about the tree issue, but she has not been cooperative, so we are seeking legal action. The trees must be removed; they

are really close to our plumbing and will cause damage to our clubhouse if not removed. Teresa has been advised by our attorney to have no further contact with our neighbor and she asked the members not to either; the attorneys will work it out. She scheduled a plumber to come fix the sand trap filter for the dishwasher and snake the lines before the Antique Sale. One of our refrigerators went out, so we bought a new one to replace it. We are putting outside rentals of the clubhouse on hold for now until we review the wear and tear these events have on our clubhouse. She thanked Susan for all her work on this. She asked Dolores O'Neal to stand and be recognized for all her hard work in making our clubhouse grounds look so beautiful. Dolores is a master gardener and puts in many hours here working on the roses and landscaping. Teresa shared that she is happy to have Annnie back and glad her son is on the mend.

Fashion Show: Hope had to leave early so she reported early in the agenda. She read the letter that she and her committee are sending to secure auction items for the Fashion Show. She thanked Desiree Ward for her help securing items. Two of our new members stepped up and are helping coordinate the auction. We are selling tickets at the meeting today and Wednesday- see Ellie if you would like to buy them today; they are \$60 each and our max capacity is 250 seats.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Contributions: Tracy Jensen reported that we have received 15 applications for club contributions. Her committee will meet next Monday to review them. 
Susan Simpson reminded members that she is accetping dues now and they are delinquent after May 31. They are \$250 and she will take cash, checks, or cards.



To Whom It May Concern;

Central Valley Blue Star Moms (CVBSM)was very thankful to have received a grant from Fig Garden Women' Club (FGWC). The funds were earmarked to be used for the 2023 Remember the Troops Packing Drive. It was requested by FGWC that the grant of \$1,500.00 be used specifically for postage. The \$1,500.00 was held in reserve until December 2023. The \$1,500.00 enabled CVBSM to pay for 76 APO/FPO packages for military personnel serving overseas.

The 2023 Remember the Troops Packaging Drive, CVBSM sent a total of 513 packages to overseas and stateside locations. And additional 96 packages were sent from January to Februar29, 2024. CVBSM spent \$4,538.96 on postage for the Remember the Troops Packaging Drive. For this fiscal year to date (9/1/23 to 8/31/24), CVBSM has spent \$6,725.43 on postage and \$8,592.60 on supplies to fill the boxes.

Pictures from the 2023 Remember the Troops Packaging Drive are located on pages 2 - 4 of this letter. Thank you again for your generous donation that helps CVBSM bring some holiday cheer to service members who were not home for the Holidays.
