

## Fig Garden Woman's Club Board Meeting Minutes November 4, 2024

**Call to Order:** The board meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by President Kim Gould. Vice President's Report: First Vice President Debbie Reuland thanked Donna Strickler and Shirley Zaver for the lovely Fall refreshments.

**Approval of the Minutes:** Reporting Secretary Charlotte Zylka Singer informed those in attendance that the minutes from the Board Meeting held on October 7 were prepared and provided via email by Member Desiree Ward. Debbie Reuland made a motion to approve the minutes as written, and the motion was seconded by Irene Wiegand. The motion was voted on, and the minutes were approved.

**Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer Susan Simpson reported that the Club's checking account, as of October 31, 2024, has a balance of \$65,345.77 and investments totaled \$140,718.89 for a total of \$206,064.66. Income for the last period was \$2,094.57 and expenses were \$7,894.41 for a negative of \$5,799.84. Susan reported that she would have a final tally next week, but that the estimated net from Trash to Treasure was about \$22,600.00. The not yet final income from Bingo and Bubbles is \$1,140.29 and Maker's Market is \$1,534.57.

**Corresponding Secretary's Report:** Corresponding Secretary Joyce Gaskins reported that she picks up and distributes the club's mail. Joyce said that she now has the list of the nine members who wish to get a mailed hardcopy of the Fig Leaf which she will see to. Joyce also said that the club had received an invitation for members to consider attending, on November 9 and 10, "A Little Night Music."

**President's Report:** President Kim Gould thanked the membership for their hard work on Trash to Treasure and Janelle Dunn along with Denise Price for chairing the event.

#### STANDING COMMITTEES:

**Amenities:** Chair Karen Tozlian reported that Members Janet Hill and Peggy Abels are ill and at Saint Agnes Hospital. President Kim Gould thanked Karen Tozlian and the Amenities Committee for their work supporting club members who are dealing with personal challenges.

Fig Leaf and Program: Second Vice President and Fig Leaf editor Suzanne Crosina-Sahm asked that any additions or corrections of her draft of the November Fig Leaf be brought to her attention. She reported that the speaker at the November 13 general luncheon meeting will be Lieutenant Colonel Linda Phillips from the Central Valley Honor Flight. Ms. Phillips will be joined by Marjorie Williams who served in the Women's Army Corps from 1956 to 1958. Ms. Williams will be accompanied by her great niece Brenda Negley who also is an Army Veteran. Suzanne further reported that she is still looking for musical entertainment for December, but that on January 8, 2025, the speaker will be Cathy Garner of Fresno Wildlife Rehabilitation who will talk about the birds and wildlife of Old Fig Garden. **Membership**: President Kim Gould reported for Third Vice President Dena Reynolds that the club has one new member who had been on the waiting list.

**Social Media Report**: Chair Barb Moen reported that Facebook likes were up 21 for a total of 744 and followers were up 124 for a total of 1,148, Instagram followers were up 16 for a total of 431, and Website Member Resources were up 2 for a total of 82.

**Federation**: Chair Karen Tozlian informed those at the Board Meeting that as a follow up to The National Day of Service, the Club will be collecting at the December General Luncheon Meeting new, unwrapped, and unopened packages of underwear for men, women, and children and donating them to the Poverello House. Karen said that if members are interested in more Federation news, they can sign up for QuickBytes which is a California Federation of Women's Clubs weekly e-newsletter.

## Fig Garden Woman's Club General Luncheon Meeting Minutes November 13, 2024

**Welcome:** President Kim Gould welcomed the membership to the general luncheon meeting.

**Collect**: Member Judy Garabedian led the membership in reciting the Club's Collect.

Music: Member Pam Alexander led the membership in singing "America the Beautiful."

**Inspiration**: Member Kathleen Lehman read a piece entitled "The Art of Thanksgiving."

**Back When**: Third Vice President Dena Reynolds and Historian Leesa Kazarian read from the club's old historians' notes. In 1922, the historian wrote about club activities which were the Christmas Bazaar, Husband's Night when the men entertained the women, music, and dances. In 1925-1926, the club's 72 members were having a hard time paying the monthly mortgage of \$20. They made do buying packing and selling figs.

**President's Announcements**: President Kim Gould thanked Co-Chairs Joanne Bazarian and Hope Rosky for their work on the fabulous new event Bingo and Bubbles. Kim also thanked Pam Cowling for providing the yummy desserts at the event. Kim thanked Co-Chairs Janelle Dunn and Denise Price for their hard work on Trash to Treasure and announced that those members who did not work or provide food for the Trash to Treasure event will be getting a telephone call and asked what alternative activity, in addition to the other committees they have signed up for, that they would like to work on to fulfill their Trash to Treasure obligation.

**Memorial Program**: Member Teresa Kirkorian recognized three club members who passed away this last year. They were Doris Rahn, Annette LaRue, and Rosalie Grace Kearns Jorgensen. Several members of Ms. Jorgensen's family were present for the luncheon. Three candles were on the main table in honor of these members.

**Program/Speaker**: Second Vice President Suzanne Crosina-Sahm announced that today's program would be in honor of Veteran's Day and thanked Member Cam Maloy for setting up today's program. The

speaker was Lieutenant Colonel Linda Phillips who had until her recent retirement headed the Central Valley Honor Flight program. Lieutenant Colonel Phillips was accompanied by two other veterans Marjorie Williams and her great niece Brenda Negley. The Central Valley Honor Flight program has sent more than 2,000 veterans (58 of whom were women) to Washington D.C. to visit the war memorials there and has helped veterans from the American Revolution on to register. It is a healing program especially for Vietnam veterans and a way to thank veterans for their service. There is a two-year waiting list with preference being given to Vietnam veterans and those who are terminally ill. Of the 58 women who have gone on the Central Valley Honor Flight, 31 were from World War II, 15 from the Korean War, 1 post Korean War, 2 post Korean War but also served in Vietnam War, and 9 from the Vietnam War.

**Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by President Kim Gould at 12:55 p.m.

**Minutes:** Recording Secretary Charlotte Zylka Singer informed the membership that the minutes from the last general luncheon meeting were provided in the November Fig Leaf. Erika Hoppe made a motion which was seconded by Lisa Jelinek to approve the minutes. The motion was voted on and passed.

One thankyou note was to Bobbi Herrington for a generous donation made to Trash to Treasure and the other to Michael Osterlof for his work on Trash to Treasure.




