STANDING HOUSE RULES & CLUBHOUSE RULES AND PROCEDURES

STANDING HOUSE RULES

The following rules have been established to assure the smooth functioning of the Clubhouse for all members.

(Revised Mar 2021)

Rules of Membership and Officers

1. Keeping the Standing House Rules current is the responsibility of the Bylaws Committee.
2. Promotion of Federation Clubs shall be encouraged.
3. Each member shall be notified by the Membership Chair that reasonable attendance and active service are required. Minimum service shall consist of working on one fundraising activity; in addition, all members are expected to work on the Trash to Treasure Days fundraiser plus at least one other committee. The Membership Chair shall give each new member a document covering the obligations of membership.
4. Members shall notify the First Vice-President if unable to serve on assigned committees and be transferred.
5. All members of the Board of Trustees shall keep procedure books. The First Vice-President shall collect all books at the end of the Club year and distribute them to the next Board of Trustees. After the end of the Club year the Committee Chairs of the current year should meet with the Committee Chairs of the incoming year. This personal meeting could help answer any questions the new Chairs might have.
6. The Membership Chair and at least one other member will meet with people who have indicated an interest in joining Fig Garden Woman's Club but are not acquainted with any current members.
7. Contact information for new members and changes to contact information for current members will be published in the Fig Leaf at the earliest date possible.
8. Any individual or group accumulating funds shall be required to submit them to the Treasurer and present a record of income and expenses incurred to the Treasurer for payment.

9. No individual or group shall be allowed to earn money and stipulate its use without the previous approval of the Board of Trustees.
10. Motions must be submitted in writing on the "Motion Forms" to the President and Recording Secretary at the time the motion is made.
11. The Treasurer must pay for all catered luncheons. Members, bringing guests, must pay the current price for her guest's lunch to the Treasurer. The Chair of the teas may turn in receipts to the Treasurer and receive reimbursements up to \$75.00 per function to cover the expenses. The Chair of the monthly meetings may turn in receipts up to \$150 per function to cover expenses. Any money made from centerpiece sales is to be turned in to the Treasurer.
12. New fundraising events may be introduced by the members and will require the approval of the Board of Trustees.
13. No member or friends or relatives of a member may use the Club roster for business, political or religious reasons.
14. Employment of relatives of Club members is not allowed without Board approval.
15. Courtesy to anyone speaking or presenting to the Club shall be observed so that proceedings may be heard by all members. There should be no noise, talking or cleaning up in the kitchen during presentations or meetings.
16. The receiving line shall consist of three members: a Past President (if possible); a new member; and one other. The Hospitality Chair and the Membership Chair shall be responsible for filling the receiving line.
17. Two Past Presidents shall preside at the tea table, if possible, or substitute an active member.
18. The Retiring President shall receive a gift from the Club, to be purchased by the First Vice-President with Club funds and presented by the First Vice-President at the May Luncheon.
19. Executive Officers and Clubhouse Chair shall be exempt from monthly luncheon service. The Membership Chair may be excused from monthly luncheon service if a new member is being introduced. Past Presidents do not serve on the March Luncheon committee.
20. The Marathon Bridge Chairman has the authority to decide if non-Fig Garden Woman's Club members can play.
21. The Building Maintenance Account was established to pay for Club maintenance expenses that are larger than normal monthly and

- annual expenses. These tasks are to be undertaken as designated and implemented by the Preservation and Planning Committee.
22. When a member dies, the President will authorize a donation of fifty dollars (\$50) to be made by the Club to the Memorial Building Fund in memory of the deceased member and her name will be placed on the Club's bronze plaque.
 23. The Memorial Building Fund is chaired and managed by the immediate Past President. It is her responsibility to acknowledge donations and maintain the Book of Remembrance/Gold Plaque.

CLUBHOUSE RULES AND PROCEDURES

1. The Clubhouse and parking lot shall be used for activities that meet the objectives of the organization. Other uses of the Clubhouse and parking lot require the approval of the Clubhouse Usage Chair and the Executive Board.
2. Lace tablecloths, silver, fine china or hollow ware are to be used for teas and other Club events and shall not be removed from the Clubhouse for any purpose. The Chair should see that silver is carefully washed, dried, stored and locked up after use. Keys to china and silver cabinets may be obtained from the Clubhouse Chair. Removal of other items may be requested by a committee for use in a Club activity, and permission may be granted by the Executive Board.
3. Clubhouse keys may be secured from the Clubhouse Chair or the First Vice-President and should be returned promptly after all duties have been completed.
4. Duties of the Clubhouse Chair shall be consistent with the efficient management of the Clubhouse in all aspects. She shall be responsible for a current inventory and the employment and supervision of maintenance personnel. The Clubhouse Chair is responsible for overseeing the fall cleaning, purchase of all supplies, arrangement for necessary repairs and maintenance of equipment and Clubhouse interior. The Clubhouse Chair will assist the Committee Chair as necessary for Clubhouse special events and conduct a regular inspection of the facilities.
5. Monthly Committees will provide a centerpiece for each table. The Committee should order linen rental for tables. Always put a

tablecloth on the Executive Table, and have it longer on the foyer side of the Clubhouse. The Executive Table is best set up at the stage end of the room. Following the luncheon, they will see that all tables have been cleared and the kitchen, coffee room and Clubhouse are in good order. The Custodian will clean the Clubhouse, including the foyer and the Housekeeper will clean the restrooms. Custodians are not responsible for the coffee room. Monthly Committee duties are not ended until all Clubhouse rules have been met.

6. All Members using the Clubhouse for committee meetings and Club activities as well as Special Committee Chairs are responsible for putting the kitchen, coffee room and Clubhouse in order. Garbage and trash are to be placed in outside containers. Any coffee pots and serving pots are to be washed with hot soapy water, well rinsed and dried, counter and sink cleaned. Coffee should be stored in the closet; opened cans stored in the refrigerator. All lights should be turned off, heating should be set to 50 degrees in fall, winter and spring. Air conditioning should be turned off if used in late spring and summer. All windows should be locked and shutters closed. Check Carefully That All Clubhouse Doors Are Locked (Front, Kitchen, Coffee Room, Patio, Garden Room and Patio Gate).
7. The thermostat may be found on the northwest wall near the front door of the Clubhouse, which controls the west end of the Clubhouse. Another set of controls is near the coffee room door, which controls the east end of the Clubhouse. Check batteries if the system is not working. This system does not control the kitchen or the Garden Room.
8. Cooling and heating of the Garden Room are operated by controls on the east wall. Keep all doors closed when the unit is in use. This is a small unit that will not heat or cool the Clubhouse or kitchen. In fall, winter, and spring the heat may be left on at 50 degrees. The air conditioning should be turned off when leaving in summer.
9. State regulations require that the patio gates must be unlocked when the Clubhouse is in use.
10. The president may require that motions be submitted in writing on a "motion form" at the time the motion is proposed to the board.

Bylaws for the regulation, except as otherwise provided by statute of its articles of incorporation, of the Fig Garden Woman's Club, a non-profit corporation.

BYLAWS

(Revised Feb 2024)

ARTICLE I

Location

- Sec. 1. The principal office of this Corporation, known as the Fig Garden Woman's Club, is hereby fixed and located at 4550 North Van Ness Boulevard, Fresno, California, 93704.

ARTICLE II

Motto

- Sec. 1. The motto of this Club shall be "Home and Community."
Sec. 2. The Club Emblem shall be the fig leaf, and the Club colors green and white.

ARTICLE III

Objectives

- Sec. 1. The Fig Garden Woman's Club seeks to provide social and educational activities for members and to better the community through the awarding of college scholarships and the financing of philanthropic projects.
Sec. 2. The Fig Garden Woman's Club is an organization formed under the California Federation of Women's Clubs and the General Federation of Women's Club and is a federal tax-exempt organization under Internal Revenue code Section 501 (c)(3).

ARTICLE IV

Policies

- Sec. 1. All partisan, political and religious topics shall be prohibited from discussion at any meeting or activity of this Club. It shall be a policy of the Fig Garden Woman's Club, unless requested to do so by the Federation of Women's Clubs, not to endorse partisan candidates, issues, or to circulate petitions.

ARTICLE V

Club Year

- Sec. 1. The Club year shall be from July first through June thirtieth.
- Sec. 2. The Club will hold regular luncheon meetings September through May.

ARTICLE VI

Membership

- Sec. 1. Members may invite potential members to visit the Club for all events except Board Meetings. They may be invited to join anytime during the Club year. New members will be introduced at a General Meeting after their dues have been paid. Membership is limited to two hundred (200) active members exclusive of Emeritus Members, Honorary Members and Life Members. The Board of Trustees is granted the discretion to limit the number of members as deemed necessary for the good of the Club.
- Sec. 2. When it is in the best interests of the Club, the Board of Trustees shall have the power to request the resignation of any member. If said member fails to comply with the request, the Board of Trustees shall then take such action, as it deems necessary.
- Sec. 3. Any member desiring to withdraw from the Club may do so by presenting a resignation in writing.
- Sec. 4. Honorary Membership is the recognition of a member of the community for outstanding service to Fig Garden Woman's Club and/or the community. The Club's Review Committee will consider all nominations. An Honorary Member has no privileges of membership. An Honorary Member will be listed in the handbook for one year.
- Sec. 5. Life Membership may be bestowed after 30 years of service to the Club and/or Federated service. The application must be written and based on meritorious service. The Club's Review Committee will consider all applications. A Life Member shall have full privileges of the Club, shall pay no dues and shall receive a complimentary Handbook, the Fig Leaf Newsletter, and complimentary lunch.

- Sec. 6. A Review Committee, consisting of the Membership Chair and two (2) twenty (20) year members to be appointed by the President, shall consider all applications for Life or Honorary Membership. Presentation to the Board of Trustees shall be contingent upon the review committee's approval of the candidate's qualifications.
- Sec. 7. For Emeritus Membership status, a member may make voluntary application after twenty (20) years of active membership. The application shall be submitted to the Board of Trustees. She shall pay no dues, shall have no vote, shall have no complimentary luncheon, and shall receive a complimentary Handbook and the Fig Leaf Newsletter. Any Emeritus Member wishing to reactivate may reactivate at any time she chooses and will adhere to Article VII of the Bylaws with designated Admission Fees.

ARTICLE VII

Fees

- Sec. 1. Admission Fee or Reactivation Fee shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00), payable upon admission to membership.
- Sec. 2. Annual dues of members shall be two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) due April 1st. Dues will become delinquent if not paid by May 31st. If not paid by that date the membership will be considered terminated.
- Sec. 3. A nontransferable Handbook shall be issued to each member upon payment of dues. Additional Handbooks shall be given to elected officers and Chairpersons, as their duties require.
- Sec. 4. Along with the admission fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00), new members will pay dues equal to one-ninth of our annual dues for each month of membership September through May.
- Sec. 5. Any member dropped for nonpayment or for any other reason, who wishes to reactivate, must fill out a new information form.

ARTICLE VIII

Officers

- Sec. 1. The elected officers of the Club shall be President, with the option of Co-Presidents, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer. These officers shall constitute the Executive Board.
- Sec. 2. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Club, of the Executive Board, and of the Board of Trustees. She shall be an ex-officio member of all committees, except the Nominating Committee. She shall not be a voting member of any committee. She shall appoint the Appointed Officers, and the Chairs of Standing Committees (except the Memorial Building Fund), Special Committees, Community Projects, Fundraisers and Sections. The President may call a meeting of the Board of Trustees or of the Executive Board at any time she deems necessary and shall call the regular monthly meeting. She may sign checks for the Club together with the Treasurer. She cannot sign or co-sign checks to herself. She has the authority to get an Executive Board decision by telephone or electronically. She shall serve on the Endowment Fund Board of Directors.
- Sec. 3. The Vice-Presidents in their order shall preside in the absence of the President. The First Vice-President shall assist the President and shall appoint the Luncheon Chair and assist them in arranging their committees and in performing their duties. She shall be Dean of Chairs, responsible for the preparation of the District Reports, the collection and distribution of Procedure Books and in the absence of the President, Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer, may sign checks. She cannot sign or co-sign checks to herself. As First Vice-President, she shall serve on the Endowment Fund Board of Directors. The First Vice-President will be President next year, if possible.
- Sec. 4. The Second Vice-President shall be Program Chair. She shall be responsible for calling a meeting of the Program Committee as soon as the committee is formed.
- Sec. 5. The Third Vice-President shall be Membership Chair. She shall provide prospective members with information about joining, attendance, fees and service and is responsible for a new

member packet and a new member orientation event. New members will be introduced at General Meetings. She shall maintain an updated list of membership, prepare member information for the Handbook and complete, as early as possible, new member information for publication in the Fig Leaf. She will coordinate the Review Committee to consider applications for Life and Honorary Membership.

- Sec. 6. The Recording Secretary shall keep accurate minutes of each meeting. She shall report the recommendations of the Board of Trustees at the General Meeting.
- Sec. 7. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the official correspondence of the Club.
- Sec. 8. The Treasurer shall receive all funds of the Club and deposit the sum within a timely manner. She shall keep an accurate account thereof and at each General Meeting submit a statement of income and expenditures. She shall make a financial report at the close of the fiscal year. Her report is to be given to the Board of Trustees before the September General Meeting and to the membership at the October General Meeting. Checks will require (2) two signatures: the President, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer or the First Vice-President. Those authorized to sign or co-sign checks cannot sign a check to themselves. The Treasurer shall serve on the Endowment Fund Board of Directors.
- Sec. 9. The Assistant Treasurer shall act as Treasurer in the absence of the Treasurer. She cannot sign or co-sign a check to herself. She shall keep a current and accurate accounting of Club membership for all needed reports and notify members of delinquent dues. She shall serve on the Budget Committee to plan for the next Club year. She shall complete the yearly Officer Signature documents required for bank accounts and other financial accounts. She shall complete a yearly inventory of the Club's safety deposit box. She shall assist as needed with major fundraising events. With the Treasurer, she shall plan and divide duties for the year according to skills and interests. The Assistant Treasurer shall serve on the Endowment Fund Board of Directors.
- Sec. 10. Any elected officer not performing her duties in a timely manner shall be required to submit her resignation.

ARTICLE IX

Vacancies

- Sec. 1. In the event of the incapacity or resignation of the President, the First Vice-President shall assume the duties of the President. The vacancy of the office of First Vice-President or of any other elected office shall be filled by a vote of the Executive Board.

ARTICLE X

Appointive Officers

- Sec. 1. The President shall appoint a Parliamentarian, a Historian, a District Representative and two Auditors.
- Sec. 2. The Parliamentarian shall assist the President in all matters regarding the Rules of Order.
- Sec. 3. The Historian shall be the custodian of the Club records. She shall keep a record of the activities of the Club and shall submit a report of such activities at the end of each Club year.
- Sec. 4. The Auditors shall audit all records (including savings and checking accounts) of the Treasurer. Two audits are required, one in January and one after the close of the Club year. An Audit Report will be presented to the Board of Trustees and at the General Meeting in March and October.
- Sec. 5. A Certified Public Accountant will be engaged to prepare the tax forms annually, according to law.

ARTICLE XI

Board of Trustees

- Sec. 1. The Board of Trustees shall consist of the Elected Officers, Appointive Officers and Chairs of Standing Committees, Special Committees, Community Projects, Fundraisers and Sections.
- Sec. 2. The Executive Board shall consist of the Elected Officers and must be consulted to handle all emergency decisions.
- Sec. 3. Each designated member of the Board of Trustees is allowed one vote even if she holds more than one position on the Board. Each office or committee has one vote. A committee member may vote in the absence of the Chairman.
- Sec. 4. Members seeking access to Club Records, other than current records, shall contact the Historian.

ARTICLE XII

Standing Committees

- Sec. 1. The Club shall have the following Standing Committees:
- A. Amenities
 - B. Budget
 - C. Bylaw
 - D. Club Development
 - E. Clubhouse
 - F. Clubhouse Usage
 - G. Contributions
 - H. Facebook Administrator
 - I. Fig Leaf
 - J. Grounds
 - K. Hospitality
 - L. Membership
 - M. Memorial Building Fund
 - N. Preservation and Planning
 - O. Program
 - P. Publicity
 - Q. Scholarship
 - R. Telephone
 - S. Web Administrator
- Sec. 2. The Program and Contributions Committees shall each have a minimum of three members. Other Standing Committees shall have one or more members as determined by the Committee Chair or by the Board of Trustees.
- Sec. 3. The Preservation & Planning Committee shall formulate and implement long-range plans. This Committee shall have money available through The Building Maintenance Account. This account shall support large expenditures that are required to maintain the quality and integrity of the Clubhouse and surrounding property. The account will be reviewed and approved annually by the Budget Committee.
- Sec. 4. The Club Development Committee will identify the future direction of the Fig Garden Woman's Club, building on current and past achievements. It will help the Club to clarify its objectives, resources, priorities and timelines. The

recommendations and actions required will be communicated to the membership through the Executive Board and the Board of Trustees. It shall consist of five members appointed by the President.

- Sec. 5. All committees, including but not limited to Facebook, Web Site, Fig Leaf and Publicity, shall have all information that is available to the public pre-approved for accuracy and content by the President. In her absence, the First Vice-President may give approval. If the Club's Purposes and Objectives are included, they should be consistent with Article III, Sec. 1 of the Club Bylaws.
- Sec. 6. A Fig Garden Woman's Club Photo Release shall be completed by each Club member. The Form will be included in the new Member Packet and the Web Administrator/Facebook shall maintain a file of members who have given permission. Photos may be used to promote the Club and their events on the Club's Web site and other selected print and electronic media. The Release is valid until a written request to revoke is received by the Club.
- Sec. 7. Special Committees, Community Projects and Sections may be created or discontinued at any time by the action of the Board of Trustees.
- Sec. 8. The Chair of all committees shall not spend more than the amount budgeted and shall be reimbursed only up to the amount budgeted when a receipt is presented to the Treasurer, unless prior permission has been given by the Executive Board.
- Sec. 9. No event can be canceled without the approval of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE XIII

Nominations and Elections

- Sec. 1. At the January Board of Trustees Meeting, the Board shall elect two (2) current board members, who have been Club members for at least three (3) years, for a Nominating Committee, neither of whom shall be a member of the Executive Board. At the January General Meeting, the Club members shall elect from the floor three (3) members and one (1) alternate member. The three members and the alternate shall have been active members for at least two (2) years. No member may serve two consecutive years.

The committee will select their Chair. She shall have served on the Board of Trustees at least one (1) year. If there is a Past President on the committee, she shall serve as Chair. The Parliamentarian shall call the first meeting, as an ex-officio member of the committee, and review the qualifications for officers.

- Sec. 2. The Nominating Committee shall select a slate of officers. No member of the Nominating Committee may be nominated for an office. Candidates for the Presidency shall have been an active member for at least three (3) years and have served on the Board of Trustees for one (1) year. Nominees shall be informed of their duties by the Nominating Committee and given guidelines of their responsibilities.
- Sec. 3. The Nominating Committee shall submit their nominations at the February Board of Trustees Meeting and the February General Meeting if they have completed the slate of officers. If not, they shall be submitted at the March Meetings. After the Presiding Officer accepts the report from Nominating Committee, she shall name each office separately and ask if there are any nominations on the floor. The election of officers shall take place at the General meeting in March; installation of the officers shall take place at the May General Meeting.
- Sec. 4. The term of office for all elected Officers and other members of the Board of Trustees shall be for one (1) year, starting on July 1st and ending on June 30th. No executive or appointive officer shall serve for more than two consecutive years without Executive Board approval.
- Sec. 5. Qualifications for Past President shall consist of service for six months or more as President.

ARTICLE XIV

Meetings

- Sec. 1. The General Luncheon Meeting of the Club shall be held on the second Wednesday of the month. The Executive Board shall have the power to reschedule a monthly luncheon meeting if a scheduling conflict arises.
- Sec. 2. Reservations must be made with the Telephone Chair who will notify the caterer. All guest lunch fees must be paid, in advance, to the Treasurer.

- Sec. 3. The President or Executive Board may call Special Meetings. The membership may be notified by mail, email, or telephone. The notice must be given at least five (5) days prior to the meeting. The notice must include an agenda of the business to be conducted. No additional business may be conducted.

ARTICLE XV

Quorum

- Sec. 1. Twenty (20) shall constitute a quorum of the Board of Trustees. There is no specified quorum for a General Meeting.

ARTICLE XVI

Parliamentary Authority

- Sec. 1. Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be the parliamentary authority of the Club.

ARTICLE XVII

Amendments

- Sec. 1. These Bylaws may be amended by a 2/3 vote of members present at a General Meeting. The amendment shall first be presented to the Board of Trustees, then introduced at a General Meeting and printed in the next Fig Leaf Newsletter. The vote shall be taken at the next General Meeting.

ARTICLE XVIII

Meeting Procedure

- Sec. 1. Regular luncheon meetings may proceed as follows:
- A. Luncheon Procedure:
 - 1. Collect
 - 2. Pledge of Allegiance and song
 - 3. Introductions of guests and new members (if any).
 - 4. President's Announcements
 - 5. Luncheon
 - 6. Program (speaker)

- B. Order of Business:
1. Call to order
 2. Reading of the Minutes
 3. Treasurer's Report
 4. Corresponding Secretary's Report
 5. Board of Trustees Reports
 6. Standing Committee Reports
 7. Special Committee Reports
 8. Unfinished Business
 9. New Business / 30 second messages
 10. Adjournment

ARTICLE XIX

Budget

- Sec. 1. The Budget Committee shall consist of the incoming Executive Board and the Assistant Treasurer and the Treasurer from the previous year. They shall draw up a tentative budget and present it to the Board of Trustees for approval.
- Sec. 2. The Budget shall include 15% of the net proceeds from each fundraiser and Clubhouse usage and shall be deposited into the Building Maintenance Account.
- Sec. 3. Budgeted items shall not be exceeded without prior approval of the Board of Trustees and the General Membership.

ARTICLE XX

Memorial Building Fund

- Sec. 1. There shall be a Memorial Building Fund for the purpose of additions, reconstruction of and/or improvements to the Clubhouse and property. (Not to be used for maintenance.) The Treasurer and the immediate Past President shall keep permanent records of all donations to the fund with acknowledgements sent to families and donors.
- Sec. 2. The Executive Board and the immediate Past President shall approve all requests being made of the Memorial Building Fund.

- Sec. 3. There shall be a Book of Remembrance maintained at the Clubhouse in which is recorded the names of those honored by gifts to this Fund. This book shall be maintained by the immediate Past President.
- Sec. 4. The Memorial Building Fund shall be self-sustaining.

ARTICLE XXI

The Building Maintenance Account

- Sec. 1. The purpose of the Building Maintenance Account is the long-term preservation and maintenance of the Clubhouse and property. Fifteen percent of the net proceeds of each fundraiser and Clubhouse usage shall be deposited in the Fund unless otherwise designated.

ARTICLE XXII

Dissolution

- Sec. 1. All property owned by the Corporation is and shall be irrevocably dedicated to the purpose for which the Corporation was formed and is existing. Upon liquidation, dissolution, or abandonment of Corporation, such property and assets shall be distributed to a non-profit organization or organizations, organized and operating exclusively for charitable purposes and which qualifies as a non-profit organization under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) or (c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1969 revised.

ENDOWMENT FUND

The Fig Garden Woman's Club Endowment Fund was created on May 5, 2003, with a \$40,000 gift from the estate of Club member Merriam Swett. The Endowment Fund guidelines were amended and approved by the Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund by email on March 29, 2015.

I. MISSION STATEMENT FOR THE FIG GARDEN WOMAN'S CLUB

- A. The Fig Garden Woman's Club seeks to provide social and educational activities for members to better the community through the awarding of college scholarships and the financing of philanthropic projects.
- B. The Fig Garden Woman's Club is an organization formed under the California Federation of Women's Clubs and the General Federation of Women's Club and is a federal tax-exempt organization under the Internal Revenue Section 501 (c)(3).

II. NAME OF FUND

The name of the Fund shall be the Fig Garden Woman's Club Endowment Fund (the "Fund"). So far as practical, all activities of the Fund shall be conducted in that name.

III. PURPOSE OF FUND

The purposes for which the Fund is established are the following:

- A. To maintain, manage and promote a perpetual Endowment Fund that has as its primary goal the long-term support of the club, the clubhouse, and the scholarships and philanthropic projects of the Fig Garden Woman's Club;
- B. To promote fundraising and development programs for the Fig Garden Woman's Club general needs;
- C. To receive gifts, bequests and donations from the public, other foundations, private industry and a variety of fundraising activities designed for the Endowment Fund;
- D. To promote a source of funds for the Fig Garden Woman's Club general needs such as major clubhouse improvements and philanthropic projects;

- E. To carry out the work of the Fund, the policies and guidelines established by the Fig Garden Woman's Club.

IV. DIRECTORS

- A. The fund shall be administered by a Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund. The number of Directors shall be five (5).
- B. The Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund shall consist of the President, First Vice President, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer of the Fig Garden Woman's Club. A member at large shall be appointed by the incoming President from the general membership.
- C. The officers of the Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund shall be a Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary and Assistant Secretary shall be elected by the Directors from among the other Directors.
- D. Duties of the Officers:
 - 1. Chairperson: The Chairperson, or in her absence the Vice Chairperson, shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund. The Chairperson shall sign or authorize the signing of all documents.
 - 2. Vice Chairperson: The Vice Chairperson, in absence of the Chairperson, shall preside at meetings of the Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund.
 - 3. Secretary: The Secretary shall have custody of all records and documents of the Fund. Said records and documents shall be open to examination by any Director upon reasonable notice to the Secretary. The Secretary shall keep minutes of all meetings of the Directors and shall provide a copy to the Recording Secretary of the Fig Garden Woman's Club.
 - 4. Assistant Secretary: The Assistant Secretary in the absence of the Secretary shall assume the duties of the Secretary.
- E. The Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund shall meet twice yearly.
- F. Any general business items of the Endowment Fund can be discussed and approved by the BOD and the Endowment Fund by email vote and/or phone vote. A simple majority will decide the vote.

V. GIFTS TO THE FUND

- A. Anyone may make gifts of money or other property to the Endowment Fund.
- B. Anyone may make restricted gifts of money or property to be used for a specific purpose consistent with one or more of the purposes of the Endowment Fund.
- C. The Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund reserves the right to refuse a gift or a restriction on a gift.
- D. Any gifts other than cash or marketable securities shall be accepted only with the approval of the Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund.
- E. Gifts to the Endowment Fund may consist of single annual gifts, long-term single bequests, and multiple long-term bequests.

VI. INVESTMENT OF THE FUND

- A. The assets of the Endowment Fund shall be invested in bonds, certificates of deposit, and other secure investments under the management of investment professionals chosen by the Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund. Separate records shall be kept of the assets, income and disbursements of the Endowment Fund. The Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund shall report two times a year to the Fig Garden Woman's Club.

VII. DISBURSEMENTS OF THE FUND

- A. After close of each fiscal year, the Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund shall meet to determine the principal balance and net income of the Endowment Fund for that fiscal year.
- B. No distributions shall be made from the Endowment Fund if the principal balance of the Endowment Fund is less than forty thousand (\$40,000).
- C. If the balance of the Endowment Fund is greater than forty thousand (\$40,000), the Board of the Endowment Fund may distribute all of the income of the Endowment Fund to be used for the purposes of the Endowment Fund set forth above. All requests must be made in writing to the Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund.

- D. The principal of the Endowment Fund may be distributed for the purposes of the Endowment Fund set forth above only in extraordinary circumstances as determined by the Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund.
- E. Withdrawals of assets from the Endowment Fund for the purposes of the Endowment Fund may be requested in writing and submitted to the Endowment Board where they will be placed in the agenda for consideration.

VIII. DISSOLUTION

- A. If, for any reason whatsoever, it becomes impractical or impossible to carry out the purpose set forth herein, as determined in the sole discretion of the Board of Directors of the Fig Garden Woman's Club, then the Board of Directors of the Endowment Fund are hereby empowered to dissolve the Endowment Fund and distribute the remaining assets of the Fund to the Fig Garden Woman's Club to be used for its general needs.



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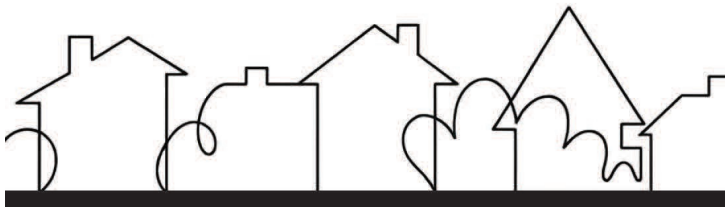
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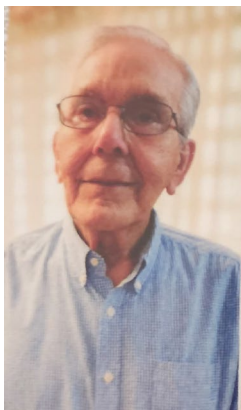
